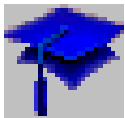

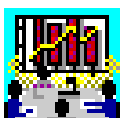

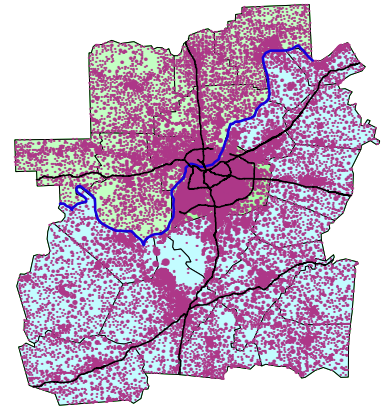

Population Distribution by Age and Gender, 1998

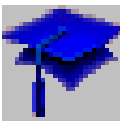
